The **14. Norient Festival** asks how to live in a fractured world – through films, poetry, music, and sound; through listening, silence, stories, laughter – and even disagreement?

Over three days, we move from the personal to the geopolitical – from Gaza to Delhi, from Swiss yodeling to West African drumming, from Sufi poetry to protest chants, from Indian classical music to bass-heavy club nights, to the silence of wild boars hiding.

As we zoom in and out from the particular to multitudes, we ask, how do we imagine the world to be? How do we live, persist, grieve, think, make, and navigate differences and conflict? What cracks stay open, and what new worlds begin to sound through them?

While one festival focus, curated by artistic co-director Suvani Suri (Delhi), traces sonic communities, fragilities, listening as thinking and resistance, the other focus – curated by artistic co-director Philipp Rhensius (Berlin) – explores the zones where poetry starts to flicker, asking, what if poetry makes futures audible before they happen?

On Saturday, we take over Dachstock at the cultural center Reitschule Bern for ten hours of concerts, club sets, and voices. An event shaped by up-and-coming Swiss artists, the visionary duo Ego Death, a captivating string quartet, and DJs along with live acts from around the globe.

Come for the cracks. Stay for what sounds through.

Aura Satz's **Preemptive Listening** shook us. It made us think about sound in moments of crisis and protest – about sirens as signals of fear, but also as a call to take responsibility and turn to people. Sound chronicler Mohamed Yaghi listens tirelessly in **Gaza Sound Man**. In the midst of a world of destruction, he records acoustic testimonies. These films left us with questions that feel urgent: How can listening become a form of action?

## **BLOCK 02: WHEN BLACK POLITICS MEETS DANCE**

Black house and dance music take center stage at our first Norient Festival night in the Cafete, Reitschule Bern. Zurich-based collective BLKSHFT and Nairobi's boundary-questioning DJ Coco Em lead us through sounds and genres like Chicago house or Detroit techno that are deeply rooted in Black musical traditions and histories. To understand the power of this music, one must connect with its roots – that's what this night is all about. The evening opens with a short talk before rhythms and beats take over. Where politics meets dance, energy flows far beyond the club.



Wind itself has no sound – it carries others. *Wind* takes this as its poetic premise; can music work the same way? The artists in *Rebel Country* suggest so, as Black, queer, Latino, and female artists use a traditionally conservative style as a vessel for their voices, shaping its future, and expanding the notion of what country music can convey. And then, what if the air carries fear instead? *The Diary of a Sky* listens to militarized Lebanese skies, reminding us that the world often shifts in the air before change reaches the ground.

Poetry makes words hum, distort, echo, and find rhythm in the air. What if poetry could make futures audible before they happen? This night of poetry and sound performances listens for those moments, where the mundane turns strange, where the personal suddenly becomes political.

A night of collective sonic fiction, where poetry rehearses the future, and the future answers back. An intimate night of deep listening with poet and activist Stella Nyanzi (Berlin, Masaka, Uganda), poet and artist Ezzo Scourti (Athens/London), performance artist Hilde Wollenstein (Berlin/Rotterdam), and poet and LGBTQ voice Logan February (Nigeria). They will be joined by sound artists and musicians, bloop, Alienationist, nithin shams, and others.



# FILM + Q&A · Perception · Listening · Experience · Counterculture BLOCK 08: EMBODIED RESONANCES

This block looks at sound through the body – in breath, nerves, instinct, and memory. It's about those who don't just hear the world, but thoroughly sense it, where silence tightens, perception bends, and music becomes a way to stay present and connected.

While the short documentary *Territórios* tunes into tension and quiet tremors between bodies and place, *A Stranger in the World* follows perception-in-motion through the sensory world of an autistic child and a parent learning to listen differently, together. *Monk in Pieces* dives into Meredith Monk's lifelong practice of voice, breath, and devotion – sound as discipline, experiment, and life force. Here, listening isn't merely theory, it's a sense of practice, of how you move, cope, and make meaning.

In a time when the world seems to be falling apart and we are retreating deeper into our small bubbles, the 14. Norient Festival opens new horizons for ten hours. Music meets performance, dance encounters club, and poetry merges with noise. Join us for the longest night in the history of our festival. Norient at Dachstock: Ego Death.



The headliner is the eponymous duo **Ego Death**, consisting of visionary electronic artist Niamké Désiré aka Aho Ssan and the extraordinary cellist **Resina**. The **Lorraine-Breitenrain Yodeling Club**, active for 120 years, meets the **Arola string quartet**, in collaboration with the playtime **Festival of the Bern University of the Arts (HKB). Kamilya Jubran**, award-winning singer and oud player from Palestine (Aga Khan Music Award 2025), and Bernese musician **Werner Hasler** (Cantonal Music Prize 2025) will immerse themselves in an intense musical dialogue – 20 years of collaboration at its peak. **Romane Ruggiero**, formerly of Bühnen Bern, performs solo in the center of the space to a new set from **Melodies In My Head**, a project by Norient founder **Thomas Burkhalter** and **Daniel Jakob**.

The collective **SOORIYAN** (Tamil for «Sun») reflects on diasporic identities and Swiss migration history. Nigerian poet Logan February navigates between heritage and future, searching for words beyond colonial structures. **Hilde Wollenstein** crosses boundaries between poetry, performance, electronic music, glitch, longing, and digital ghosts. Following are live and DJ sets by **Ruhail Qaisar**, Aleyna Günay **alias ALY-X**, **Nadia Daou** alias **NÂR**, **Parco Palaz**, **Ed Lalo**, and **KruškaTv**, presented by aXapGuLa.

BLOCK 10: PLACE POETICS: OF SENEGALESE SABAR

DRUMMING, WEST-BENGAL BASS CULTURE, AND SUFI
BAKHTI SINGERS

This film block stays close to the ground and to community. From the Senegalese music style *sabar* to Indian dub and folk music, sound grows out of land, labor, and shared time. Music isn't staged or spotlighted here; its rhythm held in families, passed through practice, carried by breath and everyday life. *Transcriptions*, *Bass Boss*, and *Music in a Village Named 1PB* move through villages and neighborhoods, listening to how music holds place and how place holds people. A quiet insistence: sound belongs somewhere – and it remembers.



The artistic co-direction of the 14. Norient Festival lies in the hands of a duo: **Suvani Suri,** from Delhi, works with sound, text, and speculative histories that take up various artistic and curatorial forms.

Berlin-based **Philipp Rhensius** is a longtime Norient editor, writes for the taz (column *Was macht mich?*) and merges sonic fiction with sardonic poetry, queer theory, and visceral sound.

From their Swiss and international network, **Thomas Burkhalter**, cultural manager and business administrator **Erna Kuduzovic**, filmmaker, photographer, and cultural organizer **Claudia Popovici**, multi-faceted artist Pass Pass activist, and DJ **Coco Em** have contributed to the program.

The curatorial team was supported by London-based visual artist Rebecca Salvadori, film producer Vinzent Preuß (Berlin), London-based film critic and curator Najrin Islam, and filmmaker and researcher Vaibhav Abnave from Pune, India.



The Bern-based cultural worker and communications specialist Janina Neustupny and Erna Kuduzovic organize the production and mediation of the festival. They are supported by musicologist Rebecca Favale (Milan), filmmaker Stephan Hermann (Bern), and copy editors Patricia Götti (Bern), and copy editor and musicologist Tucker Wiedenkeller (Cairo).

Visual artist Amogh Bhatnagar has captured the spirit of the festival in his collage work – or the unyielding determination to create our own utopia. Furthermore, video creators Robby Wahyudi Onggo (Jakarta), Stephan Hermann, and Bern-based Pablo Sulzer and Dodo Ward as well as the photographer's collective liveit.ch with Simon Boschi and Jana Leu will capture the festival with their cameras.




